The California Certified Organic Farmers (CCOF) Foundation is pleased to announce the availability of 10 grants through the Future Farmers of America (FFA) 2014 Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) Grant program! Direct grants in the amount of \$1,000 are now available to students who are FFA members, are interested in starting (or are currently conducting) an SAE in any area with a focus on **organic agriculture**, and who meet the eligibility criteria.

The application period is open now through 5 p.m. EST November 15, 2014 – *don't miss this chance to receive \$1,000 in funding toward your organic agriculture SAE!* Applicants must apply online through the FFA 2014 SAE Grant Program website (also listed below).
